Our fees cover the cost of tuition, assessments, examination fees, access to our Wellbeing, PSHEE, PE and pastoral care for learning and teaching within the classroom and the use of college facilities.

Registration fees

Payment Schedule

Annual payments must be paid in full annually no later than 20th August for the following academic year.

Termly payments – paid in full no later than the dates below for the following academic term:

- Autumn Term 5th September
- Spring Term 5th January
- Summer Term 5th March

Monthly payments

Monthly payments spread over 9 months, paid in full no later than the dates below for the following academic term:

■ Sept – May on the 1st of each month

School Trips and Other Charges

School Trips are a compulsory part of the curriculum and full charges are payable whether or not a child attends.

Parents are charged for items and property lost or damaged, where the damage was not accidental.

Notice requirements

If you wish to withdraw your child from the School, you must either give us one clear academic term's notice to that effect or pay to the School a term's fees in lieu of notice, at such rate as would have been charged for the final term of provision if a term's notice had been given. This means that if, for example, you wish to withdraw your child with effect from the start of the autumn term (i.e., at the start of an academic year) then you would need to tell us in writing to the School Office that you wish to withdraw your child on or before the first day of the preceding summer term (i.e. the final term of the preceding academic year). The appropriate amount of fees in lieu of notice will become payable by you to us as a debt on the first day of the term which would have been the final term of provision if a term's notice had been given, and the Deposit may be retained by the School towards payment of such fees. Withdrawal partway through a term does not reduce the amount you owe to the School. The School's affairs are organised on a termly basis and it is not possible for you to reduce the amount of fees, or to obtain a refund of fees, by withdrawing your child part-way through a term.

Bursary

Swansea College is committed to being socially inclusive and accessible to families from a wide range of financial backgrounds, whilst remaining self-funded. Therefore we keep fees as low as possible in order to minimise the financial barrier to attending, and offer a Bursary Scheme where families on low incomes, or in financial difficulty, can pay monthly.

Additional Tuition and Learning Support

A basic level of learning support is provided throughout the School to those pupils who need it and the cost of this is included in the standard School fees. However where a pupil needs more substantial or on-going support there will be an extra charge. Our ALNCo may also recommend a full individual assessment for a pupil. This is undertaken, and the cost met, by the parent. There will be an extra charge for additional tuition required on admission to make a pupil ready for the School.
